

## VISITOR CENTRE

Set in the woodland of the 600-acre Country Park, the Visitor Centre is open all year round. There is free car and coach parking, and a range of shops and restaurants.

- **The Restaurant, Terrace Coffee Shop and Ice Cream Kiosk** can provide everything from a cup of freshly-brewed coffee to a three-course meal. All the dishes are freshly made in the Restaurant's kitchens using local produce.
- **The Gift Shop** specialises in Sandringham souvenirs, but also has a wide range of locally-produced speciality foods, and gift ideas for all budgets.
- **The Plant Centre** stocks a range of locally-grown plants, as well as the complete range of eight varieties of Sandringham apple juice.
- **Everything Outdoor** carries a range of ladies' and gentlemen's country clothing, from hats to boots, as well as gifts for people who love the outdoor life.
- **Walks and Trails**; there are two nature trails and a sculpture trail through the Country Park, as well as the Scenic Drive.

## THE HOUSE

Built in 1870 by the Prince and Princess of Wales (later King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra), Sandringham has been passed down as a private home through four

generations of British monarchs, and is now the country retreat of Her Majesty The Queen and His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh. The main ground-floor rooms, regularly used by the Royal Family, are open to the public and the decor and contents, collected by many members of the Royal Family, remain very much as they were in Edwardian times.



## THE GARDENS



Sandringham is surrounded by 60 acres of glorious gardens. The formal

planting of the Edwardian age has given way to great sweeping glades, bordered by banks and shrubs with splendid specimen trees, to create an informal garden as delightful in autumn as in spring or summer.



## THE MUSEUM

Pride of place goes to the vintage Royal motor vehicles, including the first car owned by a member of the British monarchy, a 1900 Daimler Phaeton, and the splendid Merryweather Fire Engine which was used by the Estate's own Fire Brigade. Several children's cars are on display as well as carriages and the old Estate game cart.

King George V created his own private museum of big game trophies in rooms attached to the stable block; the remaining coach houses and stables have now been converted to

house a varied and ever-growing collection of objects. Among these are the stunning Arts and Crafts ceramic tiles and plaques designed for the now-vanished Sandringham Dairy as well as commemorative china dating back to the reign of King George IV.

Next to the Museum is the Stables Tearoom with its own garden, offering hot and cold drinks, sandwiches and cakes.



## SANDRINGHAM CHURCH

This beautiful medieval church, where the Royal Family worship while they are at Sandringham, is open during the visitor season. The highly decorated interior contains a magnificent silver altar and pulpit, together with a fine 16th-century processional cross and a number of memorials to the Royal Family.
