HOLTS charges a premium to the buyer on the hammer price of each lot sold at the following rates:

25% up to and including £50,000

20% in excess of the hammer price above £50,000 Any bids submitted via the Invaluable and The Saleroom platforms will incur a surcharge.

For UK residents VAT is payable on the premium at the rate of 20%. This is not recoverable under current UK VAT rules. VAT is also applicable to the hammer price when marked in the lot description as follows:

Items marked † are subject to 20% VAT on the hammer price as the goods are newly manufactured.

Items marked $\mbox{\scriptsize *}$ are subject to 5% VAT on the hammer price as an antique import.

Items marked ** are subject to 20% VAT on the hammer price as a modern import.

Lots indicated with §** are a modern import of post-1939 manufacture, component parts will be marked in accordance with the UK's OGIL requirements before release.

No VAT will be applied to the invoice of any buyer residing outside of the UK.

OTHER NOTES:

Bladed products are not for sale to people under the age of 18. By bidding on an edged weapon you are declaring that you are 18 years of age or over. Upon collection photo identification will be required if a person appears under 25, to prove that they are over 18 years old. Please be aware that we are unable to send

edged weapons or bladed products by postal courier to a UK residential address (Offensive Weapons Act 2019).

FIREARMS ACT 1968 (AS AMENDED)

Purchasers must hold a valid licence to purchase the item they are bidding on.

Private buyers resident within the UK who have successfully bid on a Section 1 or Section 2 item must send by Recorded Delivery their original shotgun/firearm certificate to Holts in advance of making payment. The certificate will be checked and completed on day of receipt and returned by Recorded Delivery, at which point payment should be made. Successful bidders not in possession of a valid authority are requested to pay a deposit of 95% of the invoice total with the remaining 5% payable once the certificate has been checked and completed.

Antique and Obsolete Calibre weapons are sold as exempt items under Section 58 (2) of the 1968 Firearms act – to be held as a curiosity or ornament only. Please note that by bidding on these items you declare that you are not a Prohibited Person as defined by Section 21 of the Firearms Act 1968 (as amended).

Section 5 items may only be bid on by current Section 5 licence holders without exception. A valid Section 5 authority must be produced in order to view prohibited weapons. Overseas buyers should be aware that items classified as Section 5 prohibited weapons under UK law will incur additional shipping charges regardless of their classification outside the UK.

Buyers of items covered by Section 7 should refer to chapter 9 of the Home Office 'Firearms Law – Guidance to the Police' for eligibility and restrictions.

Unless prior arrangement has been made, two weeks after the Sealed bid sale, all Section 5 (and Section 7.1 / 7.3) items will be moved to a Section 5 carriers where storage charges will be incurred.

NOTE TO OVERSEAS BUYERS:

Please be aware that items classified as Section 5 Prohibited Weapons under UK Law will incur additional shipping charges regardless of their classification outside of the UK.

Please be aware that under current UK restrictions, no modern firearms, edged weapons (or component parts) of Russian origin can be exported outside of the United Kingdom.

Goods will not be released until all outstanding charges have been met. Collection will be by arrangement.

Buyers should make arrangements with Mrs Laura Arnold in advance of the sale date should they wish to pay by cheque. All major debit and credit cards accepted.

Purchasers are responsible for shipping charges and licensable items can only be sent to a registered RFD.

Purchases may be collected on the day of the sale or by appointment from our gunroom in Norfolk. Cleared funds need to have been received and the necessary licence produced. It may be possible by prior arrangement (minimum seven days notice) to organise collection from a valuation day or delivery to a Registered Firearms Dealer.

We are unable to send ammunition and cartridges.








A RARE .177 NORMAN MAY 'VIXEN' WEIHRAUCH HW35 LUXUS BREAK-BARREL AIR RIFLE, serial no. 723724, circa 1979, with blued 22in. barrel of 'Export' length (sights absent), 'VIXEN' marking to the right side of breechblock, polished chrome-finished manual breech-catch, blued air-chamber with machined telescopic sight rail, rear-mounted push-button safety without indicator, walnut half-stock of 'Luxus' style with chequered grip and plain beavertail fore-end, blacked trigger-guard and factory sling swivels, some light marks to wood, mainspring possibly replaced (see below)

Provenance: The company of Norman May of Bridlington, U.K. were well known importers of quality German air rifles and had in their portfolio the BSF range as well as Weihrauch. Weihrauch dominated the adult UK air rifle market in the 1970's to 1990's, with their HW35 model being the best seller in all its guises. Norman May Co. did the unthinkable towards the end of the 1970's and decided to customise these Weihrauch rifles, giving them the new name of 'Vixen' and improving on what most buyers already considered perfection. It took a couple of years for the final version to be arrived at and modifications included cosmetic alterations such as chroming certain pieces of the furniture but the main difference was internal. The piston was sleeved down making the mainspring a tighter fit and less likely to buckle. The piston was also polished and chromed and a special bespoke guide-rod fitted, unique to each rifle and different for each calibre. Originally a special longer nickel-alloy coated Swedish steel mainspring was also utilised. The transfer port was also modified and particular to the calibre. Sadly, many of the original springs failed within the first few shot and were often replaced with proprietary Weihrauch springs. Three versions were produced with customer request sometimes mixing the specifications. The Standard model used a 22in. barrel and the action was fitted in the plain beech stock. A 'Luxus' version with walnut stock and a shorter barrel was also available, and lastly, the 'Export' version, both using the Weihrauch stocks of the same name. It is believed around 200 examples were made in .177 and around 500 in .22 across all models. With the retail price of an HW35 being approximately £54 in 1979, the Vixen at £157 for the top model was a considered purchase. These Weihrauchs were the first commercially available customised and tuned pieces and paved the way for later companies such as Venom and Air-Masters



BONEHILL SOLE MANUFACTURER', the side of breech stamped 'THE BRITANNIA' surrounding a seated figure of Britannia bisecting the legend 'REGD TRADE MARK', stirrup barrel locking latch marked 'PATENT', slanted air-chamber, the head with applied folding adjustable peep-sight numbered '1765', applied walnut comb, cocking link housing the triggerunit stamped 'RD394207', retaining virtually all of an older refinish £500-1.000




Provenance: It is not clear whether this self-opening tap mechanism is prototypical or of amateur origin, however it is extremely competently executed

Provenance: Another casualty of the revolution in air-rifle design at the end of the 20th century, only 178 Air-Logic 'Genesis' air-rifles were produced (this being one of the first) before the re-emergence and subsequent domination of the pre-charged pneumatic-type air rifles caused the company to fold. The rifle suffered from its extreme weight and difficulty to cock as well as its initial purchase price which started at around £625 at time of launch in 1987. They are rarely encountered today

Provenance: Admiral Sir Bartholomew James Sulivan, KCB, (18 November 1810 -1 January 1890) was born at Mylor, near Falmouth, Cornwall, the son of Rear Admiral Thomas Ball Sulivan. His early career when he was still a Lieutenant included service under Robert FitzRoy on the second Voyage of the Beagle, made famous by the presence of Charles Darwin. It was during this voyage that Darwin came to describe him as 'a real good rattling fellow. Sociable and loquacious, Sulivan established lifelong friendships amongst the crew, always knowing the latest news and gossip, and was one of the few people whose visits Darwin positively encouraged. Sulivan was the Nautical Surveyor and Hydrographer on the voyage and the Bartolome Island in the Galapagos Islands was named after him. From 1842-1845 he commanded HMS Philomel on the South American Station and surveyed the Falkland islands. Later in 1845, he found himself commander of the combined Anglo French fleet at the Battle of de Obligado, which took place on November 20. During the Crimean War, he was sent by Sir Francis Beaufort, Hydrographer to the Navy, to the Baltic to assist the Fleet Commander Sir Charles Napier. Sulivan commanded the paddle steamer HMS Lightning, and made many valuable surveys and charts of the shallow waters in which the fleet had to operate. He successfully led the bombardment ships into position during the capture of Bomarsund in 1854. From 1856-1865 he was the naval professional member of the Board of Trade and was promoted to Vice-Admiral in 1870, then Admiral in 1877, having received a CB in 1855 and later a KCB in 1869 in the Birthday Honours List. His compassion truly showed when his friend Robert FitzRoy, from his days on the Beagle, killed himself, leaving his wife and daughter destitute. Sulivan convinced the British Government to give the family £3000, and Darwin himself donated a further £100 of his own money. In 1985 the Falkland Islands issued a set of stamps featuring early cartographer's maps. The 54 pence stamp features the ship Philomel, together with a portrait of Admiral Sir B.J. Sulivan KCB. The sword has kindly been consigned by his direct descendant, Major General Timothy Sulivan

Provenance: This rifle Serial No. 353 was ordered by Sergeant Major Gilder during the British Team visit to the Creedmoor Match in the USA in 1877. This rifle cost \$20, and he also ordered a match rifle at the same time at a cost of \$60. Gilder competed with this rifle in January 1878 for the first time, shooting at 400, 500, 600, 800, 900 and 1000 yards with Sharps and his own loaded ammunition, only dropping 2 points at the first two ranges. He also shot an impressive 49 out of 50 at the 800 yard mark. It retains the backsight that Gilder fitted to replace the narrower Lawrence sight that Sharps fitted to the early Borchardt Military Rifles. The new sight has uprights further apart and the slider is reversible (notch or flat with platinum lines), allowing better scope for 'aiming off' for wind. It resembles (and may actually be) a Martini-Henry rifle sight. Gilder mentions the need for a better backsight in correspondence published in the Volunteer Service Gazette in late 1877 and its arrival in January 1878. The rifle was sporterised in period, rechambered to Westley-Richards 500/450 No 2 Musket and fitted with a Martini-Henry style underlever, pre-dating and possibly anticipating the "Jeffrey-Sharps" that Jeffrey's built using imported Winchester M1885 rifles. A Sergt Major W H Gilder was reported in the South African newspaper, the Grahamstown Journal, attending a military funeral. It could be that it is the same Gilder, having emigrated to South Africa, taking the sporterised Military Rifle with him. The WR No. 2 Musket cartridge was very popular in South Africa. This rifle is talked about in the book 'Sharps Firearms' Volume IV by Roy Marcot, Ron Paxton & Edward W. Marron Jnr. and photocopies of the relevant pages are included in the lot

or two gunmakers came up with the idea of adding an extra barrel to intensify this rate of fire. Three-barrelled sporting guns

The first proponent of multi-barrel guns was Charles Lancaster who patented a four-barrelled example in 1882. They were heavy and ponderous and his whole object was publicity. They were certainly ingenious, caught everybody's imagination and

trigger plate design was ideal for a three-barrelled gun and in the Dickson three barrel, the barrels were inline giving them the appearance of a conventional double-barrelled gun and very handsome to boot. Most of the guns were in 16 or 20 bore and in total nine were built. They were expensive guns to build, however they looked elegant and handled superbly and were designed

built two triple-barrelled inline 16 bores with his patent Boss single trigger. Being 16 bore, the width of the gun was not more than a conventional 12 bore and they weighed in at just under 7lbs. They looked elegant and at a trial at the London Sporting Park at Hendon, three clay birds were consistently smashed in the air at once. The main reason behind Robertson's building

This demonstration by Boss at The London Sporting Park was where Edwinson Green & Son of Cheltenham and Gloucester drew their inspiration from. Lot 1554 in this sale is an Edwinson Green & Son very rare triple-barrelled gun no. 6650 dating from 1912. The London Sporting Park, owned by William Watts, was the first purpose built clay pigeon ground in London to cater for city dwellers. He leased part of it out to both Boss & Co and Edwinson Green for their customers to try out their new

Edwinson Green & Son were a go ahead company building top quality guns and would later patent one of the first over and under designs in 1912. Spurred on by Boss, they took out a patent in 1902 for a three-barrelled gun, but unlike the Dickson and Boss examples, the barrels were in a pyramidal form in which the third barrel lay above the other two. Most of the mechanism was derived from the firm's standard sidelock double-barrelled gun, and the third barrel was fired by a trigger plate lock. The gun was offered in 12, 16 and 20 bore, although most guns were built in the smaller bore sizes. A single trigger was fitted and again this was covered by the 1902 patent.

Edwinson Green gained a lot of publicity with his new three barrel as it was so unusual, The Field writing "This novel form of shotgun has been designed and adapted for sportsmen who wish, so to speak for an extra string to their bow".

Very few such three-barrelled Green guns were built and what is unusual is that a fair proportion of their production was for the trade. There were sales to Charles Lancaster, Lyon & Lyon and Westley Richards who had the cheek to engrave their gun "Westley Richards Patent Three Barrel Gun". This gun even won the gold medal at the Turin Exhibition in 1911. In 1904 the Green three barrel was tested by William Watts at The London Sporting Park and as happened with the Boss three barrel, the Green gun regularly broke three clays in the air at once.

The aftermath of World War One saw a reduction in the massive bags that were so desired in the late 19th century and consequently demand for the three barrel fell away. Their era was a small window in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Due to the relationship between Boss and Green at the London Sporting Park, Green used Boss's engraver Jack Sumner to engrave their best guns and this gun on offer in lot 1554 has indeed been engraved by the renowned Jack Sumner. So if you want something very rare and pretty special, have a thought about lot 1554 estimated at £10,000 to £15,000 as it will be a long time until you see another three barrel.

IN THE FIELD By

Sir Johnny Scott Bt.

Lot 1300 in Holt's November auction of Fine Modern and Antiques Guns is a pair of Henry Atkin 12-bore self-opening sidelock ejectors, with Atkin 'Spring-opening' actions based on the Beesley/Purdey patent with the Hodges 1909 improved ejector mechanisms, considered by Gough Thomas Garwood, the leading authority on guns and shooting, to be the best of the spring-openers. These 'Best London' guns, with their fine acanthus scroll and floral bouquet engraving, were made in 1913 for Sir Cecil Boyd-Rochfort KCVO, the famous racehorse trainer, who in a long career was British Flat Champion five times. The Guns are now offered for sale by his son, Arthur.

Cecil Charles Boyd-Rochfort was born in 1887, the younger son of Major Hamilton Boyd-Rochfort, of Middleton Park, Westmeath. He, and his brothers Harold and Athur, were educated at Eton and in 1906, he was taken on as assistant trainer by the great Atty Persse, at his Park Gate yard and from there he went as assistant to Colonel Robert Dewhurst's Bedford Lodge in Newmarket and then as racing manager for Sir Ernest Cassel at Moulton Paddocks. During WW1 he joined his older brother, Arthur, in the Scots Guards, retiring from the army in 1918 with the rank of Captain and the Croix de Guerre. All three brothers were decorated for bravery; Arthur won the Victoria Cross and Harold, the Distinguished Service Order and Military Cross.

Returning to Moulton Paddocks, he found Sir Ernest in poor health and the stables run down, but he was approached by the American millionaire, Marshall Field III, who was looking for a trainer and with Sir Ernest's permission joined him as well. One of the first horses he bought and trained for Field was the outstanding filly, Golden Corn, who won the Champagne Stakes at Doncaster and the Middle Park Stakes at Newmarket, as a two-year old in 1921. Two years later, 'The Captain', as he was now known, took out his trainer's licence and bought Freemason Lodge in Newmarket, winning nineteen races in his first season. Among the owners who came to him, were his brother, Arthur, who was now breeding thoroughbreds at Middleton Park; Sir Humphrey de Trafford, Lady Zia Werner and Lord Derby.

Through his association with Marshall Field, he soon attracted some of the immensely rich American owners - William Woodward, Joe Widener, Jock Witney, Harry Guggenheim and Elizabeth Arden, of the cosmetic empire. In 1943, he began his long association with the Royal Family, training firstly for King George VI in 1943 and after his death, for Queen Elizabeth II, over many successful years he produced fifty-seven winners for the King, a hundred and thirty six for the Queen and three for the Queen Mother.

In 1944, he married Elizabeth Rohays Mary, only daughter of Major General Sir James Lauderdale Gilbert Burnett of the Leys and widow of Lt the Hon Henry Auchtmuty Cecil, acquiring four stepsons, one of whom, Henry, was to become equally famous as a trainer. His son Arthur was born in 1945 and during his career in the racing world produced champion racehorses, first at his Tally Ho Stud near Mullingar in Ireland and then at the stud he bought at Chevening in Suffolk. During a brilliant career, The Captain achieved 1,169 wins and 13 Classic successes. He was leading trainer five times (1937, 1938, 1954, 1955, 1958). He was appointed a Companion of the Royal Victorian Order in 1952 and knighted in 1968, the year he retired from racing, as a personal honour from the Queen. He handed Freemantle Lodge over to his stepson Henry, who had been his assistant for the previous four years and who was to achieve equal fame as a trainer of Classic winners.

The Captain was well known for being a first rate shot and would have been a guest on many of the great shooting estates in Ireland, Scotland - where Crathes Castle, in Aberdeenshire, was the family home of his wife - and in England. Athur Boyd-Rochfort has a photograph of the Captain shooting with his pair of Atkins at Six Mile Bottom on September 25th, 1930, when the bag was 1418 partridges. He passed the guns on to his son in the late 60's when he retired to live in Ireland and Arthur had many happy years shooting with them, before deciding the time had come to give someone else the opportunity to enjoy them.

Provenance: Henry Holland and William Mansfield patented the 'Duplex' two stage choke, patent no. 23832 of 27th October 1911, with the primary aim of reducing strain on barrels and lessening muzzle weight. In 1914, it found a more specific use in combination with another patent by the two men, patent 23196 of 27th November 1914, the 'String of Shot'. Designed for the sole purpose of being used against aircraft or Zeppelins, it comprised of a cartridge with a nucleus of a single solid ball with a variety of smaller shot connected by wire. Deemed far more effective against fabric and woodwork than a single projectile, and in response to the growing menace of marauding Zeppelin airships, in 1915 Holland & Holland supplied just over one hundred of these 'AERO' guns to the Admiralty for use with the Royal Naval Air Service. The makers have kindly confirmed that the first order was taken on Monday 21st December 1914, for 'The Admiralty' and consisted of '50 12-bore Hless ejector aero guns for H&H special Aero ctgs with patent Duplex choke boring, sighted with standard sight 50-100yds and one folding leaf, 150 yards' at 22/10/- each, together with an order for 50 mail canvas bags for same, 50 pull though cleaners, 50 clip extractors and 50 wood boxes.



Born on 25th February 1885 in Glasgow, Charles Mowat was educated at Glasgow Academy, Loretto School, and Trinity College, Oxford. He became a stockbroker like his father, Ronald W. Mowat. Mowat was first commissioned in 1905 into the 4th Lanark Rifle Volunteers. He later joined the 8th Cameronians, rising to Lieutenant in 1907 before resigning in 1911. With the outbreak of WWI, he rejoined the regiment as Second Lieutenant in August 1914 and was promoted to Captain the following month. His name is commemorated on the Helles Memorial, Panel 92–97. He received the 1914– 15 Star, British War Medal, and Victory Medal. - 1.1.6 you have notified us of all information of which you are aware or reasonably ought to be aware relating to the present or past ownerships or use of the Lot (including any association of the Lot with persons or events of note).
